TRIP REPORTS:

The Ramblings of El Cheapo Tours - Wangapeka – Christmas '83

Better late than never could be attached to this account. The Wangapeka-Karamea area could be looked at further by the club. We departed P.N. on the 28th of December and arrived midday on the 29th. The erstwhile members of our party who flew into what was meant to be the air strip, at the end of the road had an awful long walk to the start of the track. We caught them up on the first day, instead of the second, there only being a couple of hours between our respective arrival times!

The track is well graded throughout the whole of the trip. There are many side trip possibilities which we are going to look into. They say the fishing in the Karamea is superb. For the time of the year there were few people in the huts, so the area is not particularly well known, except perhaps to the hardy types.

At the Karamea end, the little Wanganui Hut is a credit to the Forest Service. One of the best designed we have seen. Pongo Lodge at Karamea is an ideal stop over at the end of the trip. Dinner, bed and breakfast for under \$10.00. They even carry your pack inside when you arrive! Dormitory type accommodation is provided.

We were lucky on the Little Wanganui Saddle – the weather was perfect, great fun and views were had by all. Philip decided to chastise Lawson with his own walking stick. A sight to behold! He then proceeded to bury it in the bog, which was so deep it disappeared from view and had to be rescued. My own turn came later.
