October – 3 – 9 KAWEKA KAIMANAWA CROSSING

Travelling to Hawkes Bay, we arrived at Makahu at 9.45 a.m. Terry had miraculously recovered from the ailments he was suffering on the journey up (chest pain, flu.) and was able to tramp up to North Kaweka with us.

It was an emotional parting as Terry left us to return home! and we headed for Ballards Hut. We floundered back onto the tops next morning through fresh snow. Strong cold winds had us moving quickly towards Venison Tops. The day ended tramping into Te Pukeohikarua (Te Puke) Hut under a cold full moon. The Harkness Valley provided lots of stream crossings and Tussock Hut at the end of it which we shared with 3 hunters. Tuesday we tramped up the Ngaruroro River from which we contemplated the next day's route up.. up.. and up. Well it wasn't as bad as it first looked. A steady climb took us past Makorako. The snow had us moving along Island Range and down to camp by the Rangitikei River. Lounged and dined out the next day. On and down to Waipakihi for next two nights. A cold wet tramp out over the Umukarikari completed our tramp.
