We can perhaps even try a little rock climbing on Wharekia, which is an amazing axe blade of rock rearing out of the farm land below the hut.

We will drive to Wairoa and will hopefully spend Friday evening at a shearers' quarters on a farm near Te Reinga. On Saturday morning we will continue via Gisborne and Ruatoria (where have I heard that name before?) and up the Tapuaeroa Valley. We will then cross the Pokihiroa Station to the hut.

TRIP REPORTS

Ngamoko Range, Ruahines - 27 August

An 8 am start and an uneventful ride up through Kimbolton and Apiti to the end of the Table Flat Rd saw us on the track soon after 9:30. The weather couldn't have been better and going up through the bush on the lower slopes saw most people comfortable in T-shirts. Above the bush line with scattered snow and leatherwood and tussock, the air was a little cooler & the lunch stop on the main ridge just after mid-day saw everyone in jerseys, parkas and overtrousers although we were sitting on a northern slope in the full sunshine. The view was across the upper Pohangina Valley (here lying in the Wellington Fault), the head water basin of the Manawatu River, inland Hawkes Bay with the Takapau Plains on the skyline. Then an hour's trip along the main ridge to Toka with a complete cover of snow. To the south lay Dannevirke, to the north the high peaks of the Ruahine Range. Toka (1625m/5005 feet) is the highest peak south of the Oroua Valley. We followed the loop track down, thus doing a circuit of the Upper Coal Creek catchment to be back at the cars just after 4pm. Liz and Jenny did the alternative Short Track Loop. A 1st rate trip.

Ohau Shelter - 7th August 1988

September 3-4 - Ahukawakawaka Swamp - Egmont National Park

The early morning departure from Palmerston North was delayed by two hours waiting for flood waters to recede so roads could be re-opened. Consequently we didn't leave North Egmont until after a noon cup of tea. The route up Veronica Track to the Round the Mountain Track was inviting - that was until we hit the full force of the south-easterlies. Undeterred we continued around to Holly Hut in clearing weather with lovely waterfalls cascading over the bluffs. A break at the hut to visit Bells Falls and then back to walking. The swamp has a broad-walk across it making, the travel quite easy. The vegetation is interesting and in summer a greater variety of plants can be seen. Up the ridge to Pouakai and along to Pouakai Hut for the night. A lovely view out over New Plymouth and the sea.

Sunday we travelled around sidling Maude Peak and over Henry Peak down to Kaiui Track and Kaiui Hut. The terrain is quite mixed - windfall, scrambling up and down creek beds and then the final stroll up the lower portion of Veronica Track back to North Egmont.

A wonderful mix of country, views; vegetation and weather. Looks like a good fit day trip in the summer although the tourist population may be *(unfinished)*
